Guiding Principles

- The goal of the Belmont-Harrison Career Center is to support the academic, social, emotional and physical needs of our students and staff. Many factors contribute to the educational options for the 2020-21 school year.
 - National, state, and local health officials and leaders make health decisions
 - All operating procedures will be considered with guidance from the Governor, the Ohio Department of Health, the Ohio Department of Education, the Belmont/Harrison County Department of Health, and the Belmont-Harrison Career Center
 - Equity and Access for all students
 - Teacher directed learning for all hybrid/online options for students
 - Internet connectivity and devices to help the educational process for students
 - Social-emotional balance and care
- 3 Levels will be used for instruction throughout the 2020-21 School Year
 - Red, yellow, and green signals will represent a different instruction delivery mode throughout the school year
 - Flexibility and patience needs to be displayed as local pandemic conditions may alter instruction throughout the school year.
- 2020-21 Learning Options for Students
 - Parents can choose the option that is best for their student
 - Option 1 - Face to face instruction in our buildings
 - Option 2 - Remote learning from home for academic courses (math, science, language arts, social studies, and intervention) will be provided by Belmont-Harrison Career Center for any family that is not comfortable sending their student(s) to school. Career-technical courses will be offered at BHVSD sites.

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- Students will be divided into Group A or Group B
- If a family/household has school-aged children with different last names, then the students will attend in-person classes on the same days.
- Group A would attend on Tuesday/Thursday
- Group B would attend on Wednesday/Friday
- On days the students are not in session, students will be expected to participate in instruction remotely

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Remote learning is the educational option if your child or student cannot physically attend school due to health conditions or you do not feel comfortable sending your child to school in the fall.

- Reliable Internet and Devices for instructional purposes
- Attendance taken daily
- Special education services may be adjusted

- The district may be directed to close by Belmont/Harrison County Health Department
- If ODE or Belmont/Harrison County Health Department develop “district specific” Risk Levels, those *may* become triggers for changes
- ODH announcement on Thursday, district response is following Monday for parental planning
- If teacher and staff COVID-19 absenteeism outpaces available substitutes, school may shift to remote learning.

Healthy Learning Environments

Creating a Healthy Learning Environment:

- Vigilantly assess for symptoms

- Thoroughly clean and sanitize school environment throughout the day and evening
- Wash and sanitize hands and teach effective personal hygiene practices to prevent spread
- Social distance as much as possible
- Draw outside air into air conditioning system
- Right-hand hall travel

General Strategies for Good Hygiene:

- Assess for COVID-19 Symptoms prior to work/school. If you feel ill, please stay home and do not return to work/school until you meet CDC criteria or are cleared by a medical provider.
 - Students and staff with symptoms will be sent home (Fever 100 or higher or any additional symptoms).
- Practice social distancing when possible.
- Frequently wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with your elbow or a tissue and dispose of the tissue.
- Clean and sanitize frequently touched items and surfaces.
- If there is a confirmed positive case of COVID-19 in your home, please contact your child's school and health providers.

Cleaning

- **Prior to the Start of Each Day:**
 - All commonly touched items will be disinfected with approved cleaners
 - All hand sanitizer and soap dispensers checked for daily use
- **During the Day:**
 - Desks and commonly touched items will be cleaned
 - Hand sanitizing stations and soap dispensers will be refilled as needed
- **At the End of Each Day:**
 - Deep cleaning of all schools will be completed on a daily basis
 - Areas used for extracurricular activities will also be cleaned after usage

Career-Tech Labs

- All tools must be cleaned after individual use and at the end of each lab period
- Clean-up will occur the last (15) minutes of the lab period
- No food or drink permitted in lab classrooms
- Social distancing must be practiced/Face masks will be worn as needed
